

Hanna Gustav Flyborg (1874 – date of death unknown)

Hanna left Madame Bergman Österberg's College in 1897 and her first post was as an instructress at the Women's College of Baltimore during 1897-98. Hanna taught Swedish gymnastics, coached and umpired basketball and introduced her students to hockey. This was well before Constance Applebee started her pioneering programme in 1901 in the courtyard behind the gymnasium at Yale.

Hanna was involved with at least one of the hockey clubs at the Women's College of Baltimore. Alongside a drawing of a hockey player, reproduced in the 1899 edition of *Donnybrook Fair (the College Magazine)*, sixteen students were listed, with Hanna Flyborg as their instructor.

Madame Bergman Österberg's report, dated 1898, also indicated that Hanna had introduced hockey to the college in 1897. Hanna also made reference to the use of Zander machines at the college, which were popular in gymnasiums in America. She also stated: *I have had an admirable opportunity of keeping up my studies in Anatomy at the Women's Medical College. In May I passed the final examination for the doctor's degree in Anatomy.*

Madame invited Hanna to join her staff in 1898.
