

Mary Grieg Grey (1885-1974)

Mary was born in Edinburgh in about 1886. She was educated at George Watson's Ladies College, Edinburgh, for ten years. She completed her training at Bergman Österberg Physical Training College in 1905. The 1908 College Register recorded she was working for the School Board Offices in Paisley.

Mary played for Scotland, in the very first international lacrosse matches, against Wales and England in 1913.

During WWI she served with distinction in France and Salonica as Head of the Remedial Section of the Almeric Paget Corps for which she received decorations from both countries together with the British War Medal and Victory Medal.

After the WWI she became an Organiser for the West Riding of Yorkshire and then was invited to join George Newman's staff at the Ministry of Education as an HMI in the South Eastern Division.

She is listed on the 1939 census as living in Guildford and her occupation was an HMI.

Mary died in Bournemouth in 1974.
